Dear Friend,

Nationally 32 million people were uninsured in 2014. In 2013, more than 27,000 Brown County residents were uninsured. Studies have shown that uninsured patients are less likely to have regular out patient care and are more likely to be hospitalized for avoidable health problems. Many of our patients are one paycheck away from being homeless.

For the past 44 years the N.E.W. Community Clinic has been providing quality care to the hard-working, lowincome and uninsured people of Brown County. The clinic opened in July of 1971 under the name of the Green Bay Area Free Clinic as a social work project of a University of Wisconsin—Green Bay student. We now have 3 clinics: our main site is centrally located at 622 Bodart St.; our second site, The N.E.W. Medical Clinic at NWTC, opened in July of 2006 is on the west side of Green Bay; our third site. Outreach Health Care, is located at 879 Mather St. across the street from The Salvation Army. In the fall of 2011, we opened another collaborative program providing dental care for Medicaid patients that were utilizing local emergency rooms for dental care and pregnant women who participate in the WIC program and need dental care. In 2013, we doubled the capacity at our dental clinic at NWTC. In 2014, Bay Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery Clinic and Oral and Maxillofacial Surgeons of Bay Care Clinic started volunteering at our new dental clinic to provide oral surgery.

Interesting Facts:

- •About 71% of these patients stated that coming to the clinic prevented them from going to the emergency room and 91% of the patients stated that we were able to meet their immediate health care needs in 2015.
- •There were 4,008 patient visits in 2014 at the Bodart St. clinic.
- •Our Health Care for the Homeless program treated 1119 new patients in 2014 and had over 5,000 total patient encounters.
- •The average cost per visit is \$43.48 which includes the doctor visit, lab test(s), sample medications and an interpreter if needed.
- •The average earned income per uninsured family that we served was \$6,415 per year.
- •Total encounters for all programs exceeded 30,000 patients in 2014.

With additional funding we would have the ability to assist more patients. As a valued member of the community we are reaching out for your support. attentiveness, and dedicated time spent by Dr. Tibbetts and the medical staff/volunteers have been unsurpassable.

Never did I feel rushed or put through a shortened exam. Each and everyone made me feel worthy, and without them I know I would have died. I know this!

With all that said, it wasn't until recently that I found myself in need of the N.E.W. Community Clinic once again--this time utilizing the professional dentistry services at the N.E.W. Dental Clinic. I remain every bit as impressed, actually awe-struck with the highly professional services provided me; and can honestly, and wholeheartedly, say that upon my three visits. I was never made to feel less of a person, or respected any less.

I humbly thank you all so very much for all you have done for me! May God's blessings shine upon every heart and soul that passes through your doors, and may other medical professionals hear his callings—big and small.

STUDENTS GAIN EDUCATION THROUGH N.E.W. COMMUNITY CLINIC

N.E.W. Clinic at NWTC continues to serve as a teaching medical clinic, providing access to quality, comprehensive, and compassionate health care to the underserved in our community, while enhancing the education of tomorrow's health care providers.

The clinic is pleased to have transitioned to the health information technology Epic EMR System on November 10. This transition addresses our clinic objectives to offer the best quality patient care, patient safety, and healthcare efficiency, while maintaining patient information security.

Several NWTC Health Science programs – Associate Degree Nursing, Respiratory Therapist, Medical Assistant, Healthcare Business Services, and Health Information Technology - continue to utilize the clinic for student clinical experience and service learning opportunities.

COMMUNITY SMILES FOR DENTAL CARE

The N.E.W. Dental Clinic on the campus of NWTC continues to serve low income or uninsured people in Brown County by providing dental services close to home.

In spring 2013, HSHS St. Vincent and HSHS St. Mary's Hospitals donated funds that allowed the clinic to double its capacity. The six chair dental clinic operates year round, Monday through Friday. In the last year, volunteer oral surgeons started seeing patients one half day per week. For the first half of 2015, the oral surgeons held 23 clinic dates, where they saw 211 patients and completed 588 extractions and for oral surgeries.

This was made possible thanks to additional funding from HSHS St. Vincent and HSHS St. Mary's Hospitals to purchase the equipment needed for procedures in the clinic.
